# ACADEMIC PLAN: NORTHEASTERN 2025

# ADMISSIONS AND ENROLLMENT

- 62,272 applications were received for 2,800 slots in the fall 2019 freshman class
- 77% of freshmen ranked in the top 10% of their high school class, compared to 38% in fall 2006
- 18,921 full-time, degree-seeking undergraduates; 10,068 full-time, degree-seeking graduate students

# DIVERSITY

- 22% of the student body are students of color, up from 16% in 2006
- 9,532 full-time, degree-seeking international undergraduates and graduates from 141 countries

# **EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING AND CAREER SUCCESS**

- 3,234 students pursued experiential opportunities in 146 countries in 2018–2019
- Northeastern placed 11,787 students in co-ops in 2018–2019, up from 6,301 in 2006–2007

- The university connected students with 3,052 co-op partners around the globe in 2019
- 93% of graduates are employed full time or in graduate school within nine months of graduation

#### RESEARCH

- \$178.8 million in external research funding in 2019, up from \$48.7 million in 2006
- 267% increase in external research awards since 2006

#### **ENTREPRENEURSHIP**

- 408 active ventures at IDEA, Northeastern's student-run venture accelerator
- 1,646 patent applications filed by faculty and students (2006–2018)
- 54 spinout companies formed by faculty and students since 2006

#### FACULTY

- Nearly 1,500 full-time faculty, with 701 tenured and tenure-track faculty hires since 2006
- Student to faculty ratio is 14:1, with 68.1% of classes having fewer than 20 students

#### ALUMNI

- More than 260,000 alumni in 179 countries
- 46 global communities, with 3 new communities in Guangdong Province, China; Mumbai, India; and Taipei, Taiwan; and 5 new programs in Chennai, India; Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam; Karachi, Pakistan; Kathmandu, Nepal; and Manama, Panama

#### **TUITION AND FINANCIAL AID**

- Tuition—\$51,522; room and board—\$16,270
- Northeastern is providing \$296.2 million in financial aid, not loans, for undergraduates in 2019–2020. This increased investment has reduced the average debt among all students graduating by 44% since 2006–2007.

#### PHILANTHROPY

- \$1.4 billion raised during Empower: The Campaign for Northeastern (concluded in 2017)
- \$120+ million raised in 2018–2019
- 12% alumni participation rate

• Endowment market value: \$1.07 billion; total operating expenses: \$1.27 billion
