NEW AND EXPANDED INITIATIVES



The Affirmation Access Project distributes free gender-affirming care items to queer, trans, non-binary, gender non-conforming, Two-Spirit, and questioning students and ensures that students have ongoing access to community support on and off campus.

OWAM (One Weekday A Month) Affinity Groups launched in spring 2023, pairing student leaders with center staff and creating monthly meeting space for five new groups: LGBTQIA2S+ Latine students, LGBTQIA2S+ international students, graduate LGBTQIA2S+ students, disabled LGBTQIA2S+ students, and bi/pan/queer+ students.

Peer Resource Navigation launched in fall 2022 as a strategy for expanding the center's capacity to provide one-on-one support to students seeking referrals to healthcare, legal, administrative, or community resources on and off campus.

Faculty affiliate Alexander Gamero-Garrido joined the center's team as part of Cultural and Spiritual Life's new Faculty/Staff Affiliate program.

First Thursday Socials created a regular social space for students with themed gatherings on the first Thursday evening of each month during the fall and spring semesters.

Campus collaborations expanded our impact on and beyond campus, including work with the Cultural Life Education Team, the EMPOWER Students of Color Conference, and Peace and Social Justice Week; and partnerships with Columbia University, MIT, Tufts University, and Boston University.
