CO-OP: AN INNOVATIVE EDUCATION POWERED BY NORTHEASTERN

Northeastern students have the edge in the real world–and it's because of experiential education. Since 1909, co-op has integrated study and work, bringing students a powerful learning experience and a seamless college-to-career transition. Our graduates know how to translate their skills to match employers' needs and have the resumes to prove it.

Students from the College of Science work at co-ops around the world, across all industries—at startup companies, public service agencies, and nonprofit organizations. However, some worthy organizations are unable to offer full salaries, while others pay nothing at all due to budget constraints. Although compensation is limited, these co-ops provide incomparable learning experiences that lead to career-launching opportunities and create positive social impact.

The College of Science invites alumni, parents, and other supporters to help finance underfunded co-ops, opening doors to some of the most meaningful experiences a student can have.

CO-OP FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES

Customized co-ops. By customizing a co-op, students can explore career paths that closely align with their passions. However, some co-ops take place at organizations that lack the funds to pay full salaries or are located in cities with costly living expenses. Your support will make even more customized co-ops feasible, allowing students to develop their interests into flourishing careers.

Research co-ops. Students can choose from an abundance of research co-ops, including working alongside a distinguished Northeastern faculty expert. However, these unparalleled opportunities are often unable to offer a salary equal to their role. By supplementing stipends for these positions, you can help students hone their skills under the guidance of a seasoned scientist.

International co-ops. Growing numbers of students are eager to work abroad, but some are discouraged by high travel and living costs. Our students have traveled to Morocco, Italy, and other global locations, working for institutions like the High Atlas Foundation and the University of Milan. With your support, even more students can partake in international experiences.

Public service co-ops. Co-ops enable students to help people in need in Boston and farther afield. Students who co-op at the Boston Community Impact Co-ops Program, for example, partner with local human service agencies and nonprofit organizations—but these students receive a small stipend. We need your help to continue offering these transformational experiences that make a positive change.

Clinical co-ops. Our students on the pre-med track can work in clinical co-ops, which help fulfill the lab hours needed for medical school applications. They learn from healthcare professionals and interact directly with patients, but are largely underpaid. With additional funding, more students can gain this valuable clinical experience.
